## **Steps for obtaining Class A CDL Permit**

Steps and advice below are from both state requirements and experience of sending hundreds of applicants to test. Students will have to schedule test times online through S.O.S:

Applicants will need have the following documents in hand **BEFORE** taking tests at the Secretary of State:

- 1) Current Drivers License (applicants may need to check on eligibility for CDL pending suspended licenses)
- **2)** An Original Birth Certificate (No copies allowed. A current US passport or card will work, see other options below if needed)
- **3) Social Security number** (Social Security card, payroll check stub, W-2 Form, either must contain full social security number no "x"ed out numbers.
- **4) DOT Physical** (Must be obtained from a medical examiner listed on the FMCSA National Registry. <a href="https://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/national-registry-certified-medical-examiners-search">https://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/national-registry-certified-medical-examiners-search</a>

## Written Exams:

There are 3 written Exams that must be passed in order to obtain a useful CDL A and work with MLTAI.

- 1) General Knowledge
- 2) Air Brakes
- 3) Combination Vehicle
- 4) Tanker (optional: for those who needed it, water trucks, tack trucks, etc.)
- 5) Doubles/triples (optional: for those who need it and for those who test on a fifth wheel hitch)
